From the Pastor:

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope and pray that this year is a great year for you and yours. We all need a break. This pandemic has wreaked havoc on our way of life, hasn't it? I know it has hit home for many, if not most, of us with family and friends getting sick, losing jobs, and or not being able to find people to hire to fill jobs. Working from home and our children learning online has created another nightmare for some people. Going back to the workplace while the children are at home means finding daycare or a babysitter/ nanny, either of which can be very expensive. We have a day care center that uses space here at our church and they are at full capacity with a waiting list.

Products are not being shipped or delivered in a timely fashion in many cases due to the pandemic and a lack of workers. Another result of this disease is the lack of social interaction. It may not seem like much to you, in fact I can think of a few people that almost enjoy being home a lot more than usual, but for many more folks living in isolation is not a good thing. Online worship is like eating tofu to me. It is a good thing to do if you have no other choice, but it lacks the connectedness that worshiping in person can bring. Although I must say that this pandemic has forced us to go online and reach a whole new congregation, which is a good thing. Sometimes multi-media is offensive to some people because they feel like technology is an intrusion on the sanctity and beauty of the sanctuary, while to others it enhances worship for them by adding videos and lyrics and even announcements. I learned a long time ago that some people learn by listening, others by seeing, and still others by doing. The multimedia experience helps meet those needs. Bottom line is that we make disciples for Christ in order to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the world because there is nothing more important than salvation! So, whatever it takes to reach more people is what we will do. Church is not our club where it is all about making people happy. Church is the body of Christ being led by the Holy Spirit to transform the world for Jesus.











