#### From the Pastor:

Wow! That was a very busy Advent Season/ Christmas. Well done thou good and faithful servants. I am proud of you. There were a lot of sacrifices made for the ministry and I believe our light shone brightly for Jesus in this community. Thank you.

They are used to video games, movies, and cell phone images. Would a television screen, instead of a large screen work better? Perhaps it would, at least I think it is worth a shot. Most other churches have multi-media, and I do mean most. Change is not easy, but the bottom line is 'what would Jesus do' and we know from Scripture that Jesus would be a nonconformist and even radical in His ministry. He ate with tax collectors and sinners. He talked with the Samaritan woman at the well, and He touched lepers. What ever it takes to win souls for Jesus because there is nothing more important than salvation is our mantra.

What else can we do? How else can we rock the boat and make waves? Please tell me your ideas. Please pray for the church. Please spread the gospel of Jesus Christ to a hurting world. God loves you and so do I.

With that in mind, we are always welcoming more volunteers to the cause. If you might be ready to answer the call to this ministry, please let us know by filling out a form from our ministry station (next to the request forms) and turn it in the church office. We will add you to the contact list and as requests come in we'll get in touch with to all our volunteers to determine who may be available.

People need help with those tasks that they just can't do any longer, are too dangerous to attempt, lost the person who always did it in the past, just need assistance, just don't want to do that any more or maybe, just can't afford to pay someone to do it. Many reasons exist... but it doesn't change the "WHY", only that things need done!! Let's work together and make a difference in some of our fellow believers' lives.

Placing signs near intersections where people need to stop or slow down is a good idea.





