From the Pastor:

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

How are you doing? You may remember that I said that I didn't want disaffiliation to become a distraction, well, it has. It is confusing, scary, aggravating, and divisive, all at the same time. Maybe this is too simplistic but it seems to me that people want to leave the denomination because of the disagreement over homosexuality and abortion. Folks have become tired of the bickering about those things and more. I think people want to go to a church that does not disagree about anything. Ha! I don't think it exists and I think it is good for us to debate different issues within the church. That debate teaches us how to defend our faith. Conflict exercises our "faith muscle" and as long as we love one another as Jesus loved us then it is a good thing.

Our Book of Discipline has not changed in many years. It is based on the Scriptures and I agree with its standards. So there is no reason to disaffiliate unless you are doing it for the money. We have an opportunity to break away from the denomination for 2% of the property value of the church and parsonage. After this year it may increase to 20%. So, if you are dissatisfied with the United Methodist denomination and want to leave (to go where exactly I am not sure) now may be a good time to do just that. There are a lot of things to be considered because it will not be a walk in the park. The real question we should be asking ourselves is, "What does God want me to do?" The answer to that question will require prayerful introspection, conversations with other Christians, and Bible study.

NEWS FROM THE LOFT (THE CHOIR LOFT, THAT IS)

All members of the music department offer a big thank you for your support and for the delicious breakfast, which we received on Music Dedication Sunday. It is a pleasure to serve you – AND the Lord!

CHANCEL CHOIR and CATHEDRAL BELLS

New members are always welcome! We welcome singers in all voice parts, especially sopranos. When current members have to miss because of illness, vacations or other obligations, we are hurting for voices. You do not need to be at all rehearsals nor at all worship services. All of the music is available to musicians on our Sharepoint site. If you like to sing, and would enjoy leading the congregation in their musical praise, please come to choir rehearsal (weekly on Thursdays, 7:15 PM in the sanctuary). For bells, if you know your right hand from your left, and you can count to at least six, you are eligible to become a member of this choir! Reading music is a definite plus, but we will teach you what you need to know. Rehearsals are weekly on Thursdays at 6:15 in the sanctuary

NOVEMBER - REHEARSAL CHANGES In November, because of conflicting events in the church and community, we will rehearse on WEDNESDAY evenings (NOT our usual Thursday) at 6:15 (bells) and 7:15 (choir) (November 2, 9 and 16) in the sanctuary. No rehearsal on November 24 because of the Thanksgiving holiday. The next normal rehearsal will be on December 1. Bells will play at the 10:45 AM service on November 20.

<u>DECEMBER</u> – Choir will be singing at the 10:45 AM service on each Sunday in December, and at the Christmas Eve services. **Bells** will be playing at the 10:45 AM service on December 18. Some members of **Bells** will be playing at the Christmas Eve services. Rehearsals for both groups will be Thursdays, December 1, 8, 15, and 22 at 6:15 PM (**Bells**) and 7:15 PM (**Choir**)

in the sanctuary. There will be NO rehearsals on December 29.

<u>JANUARY</u> – Rehearsals will resume every Thursday beginning January 5 (6:15 bells, 7:15 choir). **Choir** will be singing at the 10:45 AM service on each Sunday in January. **Bells** will be playing at a later time in January.



Happy fall ya'all!! Greetings and blessings from the youth group! The next 3 months are some of the busiest for youth group, church and Christians as a whole. November brings us Light up Night. Youth group will participate in the parade. This year's theme is Angels in our Community. While our students walk the parade route with Pastor Bruce and his truck, Ron, I and other volunteers will give out free hot dogs, coffee and hot chocolate to the community. We will be collecting small gifts to give the community that night. Thanksgiving is a time to not only give our thanks to the Lord but to serve and feed our community. James 2:15-17 says "Suppose a brother or sister does not have any clothes or daily food and one of you tells them 'Go in peace! Stay warm and eat heartily.'
