

Third Sunday in Advent, December 11



In keeping with the Advent Candle tradition of the third candle representing the shepherds and their joy at hearing the Good News, a scene of shepherds and sheep is introduced into the Progressive Nativity. Shepherds were not among the who's who in Judaic society. So it is all the more extraordinary that the first birth announcement would be given to dirty, smelly, leather skinned itinerants. As Mary & Joseph neared their destination, shepherds kept watch in their fields. Again,

ordinary people leading ordinary lives. In those moments the angels were queuing up for the big reveal. If you've ever been a part of a performance group, you know the whispering and excitement of those last moments before you take the stage. The angels gathered at heaven's edge barely containing their jubilation. Meanwhile, back on the ranch, the shepherds were tending to and guiding the flock. Herding them together and then bedding down for the night in the opening to the pen. The shepherds really did lay down their lives in the entrance.
