

Fourth Sunday in Advent, December 18



Welcome to the final Sunday before we commemorate Christ's coming. Helping us visualize history's pivotal event, are three scenes capturing the characters' continued quest towards a meeting with God in the flesh. Represented are shepherds which were keeping watch. There are some scholars who believe that these particular shepherds kept a specific kind of flock which would be populated by the sheep

earmarked for temple use. Based on the area referenced, it is quite possible that sacrificial lambs grazed there. Interesting. Bethlehem's topography was hilly. The town perched on the slopes and was surrounded by what many of us would call scrub land. We hear the phrase, "watching their flocks by night", and imagine green fields like we have here. The shepherds worked their flocks back and forth over patches of vegetation sprouting from the sandy rock soil. Forage called for moving the sheep from area to area quite frequently. Many of the fields were terraced and divided by rock walls which helped contain the large flocks comprised of hundreds of sheep. It was the shepherds' duty to keep their flock intact, protect it from predators and guide it to market. Fleece and milk were commodities which the shepherd used to sustain his group. Once safely within the grazing area of the large enclosures, shepherds would spend the night draped across any openings in order to keep unknown visitors away. In a few days, those men would indeed be awakened by visitors . . . angels. We also see Mary & Joseph's arrival in Bethlehem and search for accommodations. The mass of humanity and animals was chaotic. Mary and Joseph wended their way through narrow streets clogged with stress-filled people in search of a safe spot to rest. Bethlehem was not equipped to deal with the influx. Culturally the Hebrews would extend hospitality to visitors by inviting them in. The typical dwelling housed the family's animals on the first floor. The second floor was where the family resided. It was common for structures to have stairs to the rooftops which is the place where visiting folks were invited to utilize this upper room. Those spots were a no go for Mary & Joseph who continued to search for respite. Our third scene is a moment captured from the odyssey of the wise men. They were still some distance from Bethlehem and studied to understand the meaning of the star which beaconed. God was drawing them all to an encounter which would change the world.
