VETERANS DAY – NOVEMBER 11, 2020

“Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.”

John 15:13

All of us know a veteran. These are the brave men and women who have served our country and have been honorably discharged from active service.

Veterans Day is more than just a day to treat veterans to a free meal at a restaurant. It is a day to honor them for “laying down their lives for their friends.” Please don’t let this day go by without honoring every veteran you know and letting them know how grateful you are to them.

Our stained-glass window this week depicts the symbol for Christian Charity. Charity, is considered the highest form of love, the unselfish love for one's fellow men. What greater description of a veteran can there possibly be?



Here’s a Veterans Day quiz:

1. What year was the first Veterans Day? (World War I, known at the time as the “Great War,” officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed, and Nov. 11, 1918 is generally regarded as the end of “the war to end all wars.”)
2. What was the original name of Veterans Day before President Dwight D. Eisenhower officially changed it in 1954? (President Dwight D. Eisenhower changed the name from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor not only veterans of World War I, but veterans of all eras.)
3. What allied countries observe two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. every Nov. 11. (Great Britain and European countries observe two minutes of silence. Nov. 11 is known as Remembrance Day, or Poppy Day, in Great Britain.)
4. What allied countries also commemorate the veterans of World War I and World War II on or near Nov. 11? (Great Britain, France, Australia and Canada commemorate veterans of World War I and World War II on or near Nov. 11.)

Our church building has a continuous boiler system maintenance need. The boiler is called a Weil McLain LGB Cast Iron Boiler. It has nineteen cells on the boiler itself and some of these cells periodically need either repaired or replaced.

Recently, five of these cells needed attention. Thankfully, you, our congregation donated the funds for those repairs. Also, we have iron steam pipes inside the walls throughout the building that over time develop leaks and need repaired or replaced. Therefore, the Finance Committee has decided to be proactive so when these breakdowns occur in the future, we will have the monies available.

On 11/22/2020, we are sponsoring a pie fundraiser. But, the neat thing about this fundraiser is, an anonymous giver will match up to \$500.00 of the profit raised. And then, the matching fund held by the Finance Committee will match the grand profit total!

We do need everyone's help for our first Sand Hill Berry Pie fundraiser. We will be taking orders for half-baked and frozen pies just in time for the Holidays.
