ANOUNCEMENTS

CHILDREN'S COLLECTIONS: Our children's Collection will be sent to UMCOR for ongoing work with the refugees/migrants in Europe and the Middle East.

Crisis!!! According to the United Nations, over 4 million refugees have already fled from the fighting in Syria in the last 4 years. More than half of their population has been displaced as well. An additional 2 million have fled from Iraq. Germany has been the most welcoming country in Europe to this influx of souls, however they expect well over 800,000 refugees to arrive this year. Millions are making their way to Western Europe in search of asylum. War, poverty and religious persecution are but some of the reasons for this mass exodus from the Middle East and Northern Africa. It seems overwhelming and we wonder what can be done.

Above all we must pray. Pray for:

- an end to the current wars and religious persecutions.
- resources to care for, and show hospitality to all who are fleeing.
- the safety of each individual from the hand of those that wish to take advantage of their situation.
- the young women and children who could so easily disappear into the world-wide slave trade.
- wisdom and compassion from the leaders of European countries to take in and care for these children of

May we see this situation not as a crushing problem, but as a chance for God's love to be made evident here on earth as it is in heaven. Part of faith can also be invested in a solution. While we are not saved by works, our works give evidence of our faith.

The United Methodist Church has appointed the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) to serve as our hands and feet during disasters like tornados in the United States, and other disasters such as tsunamis around the world. UMCOR has already allocated \$2 million to provide the basics of life to persons displaced in Syria, Iraq, Lebanon, and Turkey and this is just the beginning.

COLD & FLU SEASON IS UPON US! In an effort to stop the spread of germs, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends the following guidelines:

- 1. Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- 2. If you get sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities.
- 3. While sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them.
- 4. Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. (Please place used tissues in one of the trash containers available throughout our church. Please do not put used tissues in the pew hymnal racks, under the pew cushions, or in the sofa and chair cushions.)
- 5. Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub. (Hand sanitizers are located on each floor of our church.)
- 6. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- 7. Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs like the flu.
- 8. If an outbreak of flu or another illness occurs, follow public health advice. This may include information about how to increase distance between people and other measures
