CONNECTIONAL APPORTIONMENT

Enclosed you will find a Special Offering Envelope to use for giving to our Connectional Apportionment for 2014. In order to get closer to our apportioned goal, the Finance Committee has suggested collecting this additional offering the second Sunday of each month. What is Connectional Apportionment...and how are these monies used? Some of you may remember when it was called "Mission Share". One of the unique and defining factors of the UM Church is that we are connectional! It shares its resources across all levels of the denomination to improve the lives of many through mission and justice. UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) are often on the front lines when disaster strikes in faraway places. Each local church – no matter its size – is engaged in ministry locally, regionally and globally. I have researched how the monies are used, and this is what I found.

<u>Ministerial Support</u> – Provides churches with interim pastors when needed, Nurtures ministering teams, Gives scholarships for those entering ministry, Coordinates, promotes and provides staffing camps, Provides salary and personal expenses for District Superintendent (salary, utilities, pension, medical expenses, travel), Covers moving expenses for all clergy

<u>General & Jurisdictional Apportionments</u> – Provides World Service Funding for human need, Supports ministerial education funds and Black College Fund, Supports Africa UM University Fund

<u>General & Administrative</u> – Provides gifts for Episcopal family and administrative expenses (mortgage), Covers operating costs at the Conference Center, Covers personal expenses for Conference Center Staff

<u>Conference Benevolences</u> – Gives scholarships for Laity/Training, Provides leadership ministries with UM Men, UM Women and Young Adult Funding, Provides UM Witness in PA through Church and Society, Contributes to Disability Awareness, Gives local church grants, Contributes to Global Health Issues, Contributes to Disaster Relief through UMCOR, Contributes to Native American Ministries, Provides funds for Conference publications/software and hardware upgrades, Includes Evangelism Ministry, Pays for local church seminars

<u>Conference Sessions</u> – Provides funding for Annual Meeting

Council on Finance & Administration – Provides conference wide property and liability insurance

<u>Board of Trustees</u> – Provides medical insurance for pastors on disability, pays 50% of medical insurance for student pastors, Pays property taxes, maintenance, insurance and repairs for conference owned properties and abandoned churches, Helps with the startup of new UM churches

We are encouraged to make payments to Apportionments. It is important to pay this obligation of Connectionism as it is to pay the local church bills, tithes, utilities, salaries and other financial obligations. Without everyone doing their part, the vital ministry provided by this budget and the lives it touches cannot happen. Look for the Special Offering Envelope enclosed in the bulletin the second Sunday of each month. Please pray about any additional offering you can give to First United Methodist Church of Irwin Connectional Apportionment for 2014 and 2015.
