# COLD & FLU SEASON IS UPON US! In an effort to stop the spread of germs, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends the following guidelines:

http://www.cdc.gov/flu/pdf/freeresources/updated/everyday\_preventive.pdf

- 1. Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- 2. If you get sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities.
- 3. While sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them
- 4. Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. (Please place used tissues in one of the trash containers available throughout our church. Please do not put used tissues in the pew hymnal racks, under the pew cushions, or in the sofa and chair cushions.)
- 5. Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub. (Hand sanitizers are located on each floor of our church.)
- 6. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- 7. Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs like the flu.
- 8. If an outbreak of flu or another illness occurs, follow public health advice. This may include information about how to increase distance between people and other measures
